When crossing the Polish border **you are guaranteed free assistance** with transport, food, accommodation and medical care.

### If you wish to obtain a residence permit for humanitarian reasons or refugee status:

report this when crossing the border to a Border Guard officer. If you are already in Poland, report it at any Border Guard post.

### You are entitled to assistance in the form of shelter, meals, clothing and financial benefits.

Assistance will be provided by social assistance centres in the place of your residence. The centre will also provide information about the possibility of receiving assistance from other sources. ### Where to get medical help:

If you need to be hospitalised in an emergency, you can call for an ambulance on 112.

In an emergency, services are provided in emergency rooms or hospital emergency departments (SOR). You can obtain basic medical care at the clinic or health centre nearest to your accommodation.

### I work/live in Poland. I want to bring my family from Ukraine:

The family should go to the border crossing point and take with them: passport, identity card or other document with a photo (documents may no longer be valid); for minor children without any identity document bring their birth certificate.

At the border the family will receive all information about further proceedings.

### The Sanitary Inspectorate informs:

If you are crossing the border of the Republic of Poland with Ukraine in connection with the armed conflict, you are exempt from quarantine and the obligation to present a negative SARS-CoV-2 test result. If you find yourself on the territory of Poland and you observe: high fever, cough, shortness of breath, loss of smell or taste, or you have, e.g. muscle pains and headaches, diarrhea - isolate yourself from other people and contact a designated doctor or the Sanitary Inspectorate - phone +48 222 500 115.
